ABOUT THE TORAH READING

1st Aliyah: Parshat Emor begins with G-d commanding Moshe regarding the laws of the Kohen: the prohibition against contact with a dead body, the forbidden marriages, and the special laws regarding the Kohen Gadol. 2nd Aliyah: The physical blemishes that disqualify a Kohen from the Service. The mitzvot to safeguard the holiness of the offerings and terumah, and regarding the Kohen and his family eating terunah. 3rd Aliyah: The physical blemishes that disqualify an animal from being offered as a korban. The mitzvot regarding bringing a newborn animal as a korban, slaughtering a mother and her young on the same day, eating a thanksgiving offering (todah), not to desecrate G-d holy Name, but to publicly sanctify it. 4th Aliyah: G-d commands Moshe regarding the mitzvot of the festivals of the year: Pesach, the Omer offering and counting, and Shavuot. 5th Aliyah: Rosh Hashana and Yom Kippur. 6th Aliyah: Sukkot and Shemini Atzeret. 7th Aliyah: The

mitzvot of the Menorah and the Show Bread (lechem hapanim). The parsha ends with the story of the blasphemer: A man defiantly curses G-d's Name.

Haftarah (pages 1176—1177): Continuing the theme of the laws of the Kohanim in the Torah reading, the Haftarah (Ezekiel 44:15-31) discusses the various laws pertaining to the Kohanim during the future Messianic days of the Third Temple.

An Interesting thought

Say to the *kohanim*, the sons of Aharon, and tell them: none of them shall defile himself to a [dead] person among his people. (21:1)

Question: Why wasn't Moshe commanded to convey this also to Aharon himself?

Answer: The Midrash states that if the Jews would have waited for Moshe to return (from heaven) and would not have made the golden calf, there would not have been any exile and the angel of death would not have had any power over them. When the Jews proclaimed at Sinai that they would "do and listen," G-d said that they were worthy to live forever. However, when they proclaimed a few weeks later, "This is your god, O Israel," death returned to them.

Since the phenomenon of death returned to the Jewish people through the worshipping of the golden calf, which was made with Aaron's assistance, the laws of defilement by a corpse were said to his children and not to him in order not to cause him any pain. In reality Aaron did not personally violate any Torah law, and adamantly opposed the worship of the calf, but the thought that death was related in some way to his actions would have hurt him immensely.
